## Edom Obadiah

Why study Obadiah?!

Now to him that is of power to stablish you (1) according to my gospel [which I have just laid out in this letter of Romans, beginning at 1:1], and (2) the preaching of Jesus Christ, according to the revelation of the mystery, which was kept secret since the world began, but now is made manifest, and (3) by the scriptures of the prophets [this book of Obadiah is indispensable to being established in Christ!], ...be glory through Jesus Christ for ever. Amen. Romans 16:25-27

Remember to pray for illumination (to be taught of God's Spirit—Jn.6:45)!

The message of Obadiah is that the day of the LORD is near upon all the heathen (v.15), particularly regarding their treatment of Israel!
