The Goal of the CBC Study of Mark

The goal of our study of Mark is to see Christ (1:1; Jn.12:21; Mt.17:5), to adore Him and become like Him and then to be telling others of Him (as a natural overflow of a Word and Spirit-filled heart) (last verse of Mark!). We are expecting to see Him serve, as Mark is known for presenting Christ as “Servant.”

As we begin this study of Mark together as a church, **pursue Christ** personally! Pray that you can sigh from your heart with David “As the hart panteth after the water brooks, so panteth my soul after thee, O God” (Ps.42:1). Pray that each day you will “see Jesus” (Jn.12:21).

Author and Date

“It is generally accepted and supported by the writings of the church historians that Peter was Mark’s source for the information contained in his Gospel. Since the book was probably written from Rome immediately after Peter’s death, the date for its writing is presumed to be A.D. 67 or 68. The Book of Mark, being written earlier than the other Gospels, has about ninety-three percent of its material repeated in Matthew and Luke, many times using the same words. The details that Mark gives in his brief account, however, are more graphic than in the other accounts.” Spiros Zodhiates (SZod)

Theme

The theme of Mark is the Gospel. “The beginning of the gospel of Jesus Christ, the Son of God” (Mark 1:1). The Gospel is neither a discussion nor a debate,” said Dr. Paul S. Rees. “It is an announcement!” *Bible Exposition Commentary* (BEC)
“The theme may be stated as ‘The Servant of Jehovah’” (DEH, p.14).

How Mark Differs from the Other Gospels

Matthew, written to Jews (and all men), shows (and proves) that Jesus was the long-awaited **Messiah**. Mark, written to the prevailing culture (the Romans, and all men), shows that Jesus was a **servant**. [DEH (p.14) develops very well why Mark is so suited to Gentile audiences, including its not presupposing familiarity with OT.] Luke, written to Gentiles (and all men), shows that Jesus was fully **man**. John, written more philosophically, shows show Jesus fully **God** (and was written that we might believe on this God-man and receive eternal life now, Jn.20:31). Messiah-servant-man-God!

The fact that Mark wrote with the Romans in mind helps us understand his style and approach. The emphasis in this Gospel is on *activity*. Mark describes Jesus as He busily moves from place to place and meets the physical and spiritual needs of all kinds of people. One of Mark's favorite words is "straightway," meaning "immediately." He uses it forty-one times. Mark does not record many of our Lord's sermons because his emphasis is on what Jesus did rather than what Jesus said. He reveals Jesus as God's Servant, sent to minister to suffering people and to die for the sins of the world. Mark gives us no account of our Lord's birth, nor does he record a genealogy, unnecessary in regard to a servant. BEC

Purpose

"The Gospel of Mark, unlike the Fourth Gospel, contains no statement of purpose. Our understanding of its purpose must be drawn from our evaluation of its contents.

"The opening statement of the Gospel suggests that it was Mark's purpose to present the story of Jesus Christ as the 'good news,' the unique message of Christianity. Mark's purpose was not merely to tell the story of a great religious teacher but to proclaim the coming of Jesus Christ as the saving event announced in the Hebrew prophets and expected in Judaism. His basic purpose was evangelistic, to win converts to the Christian faith." DEH

Outline of Book

“Mark does not lend itself easily to a satisfactory outline. Its contents are largely composed of a succession of events which do not readily fall into a climactic sequence. However, a roughly geographic organization of its contents is clear; therefore, after the introductory section [1:1-13], the material is geographically grouped—Galilee [1:14-4:34], Galilee and surrounding areas [4:35-9:50], journey to Jerusalem [10:1-52], and Jerusalem [11:1-16:20].” DEH
