- (3) the judgment of the believers' works (II Cor 5:10).
- (4) the judgment of the nations at the return of Christ (Mt 25:32).
- (5) the judgment of Israel at the return of Christ (Eze 20:37).
- (6) the judgment of angels after the one thousand years (Jude 1:6).
- (7) the judgment of the wicked dead with which the history of the present earth ends (Rev 20:11-15).
